The College of Motion Picture Arts, also known as the Film School, was created in 1989 to prepare young filmmakers for successful careers in the entertainment industry. Today, the presence of the Film School can be seen throughout the industry, producing award-winning alumni and acknowledged as “one of the world’s best” by The Hollywood Reporter. The school provides budding filmmakers with valuable industry-standard skills and a story-first education to allow their creativity to flourish and prepare them for a future in film.

FACULTY AND ALUMNI IN THE INDUSTRY



Filmmaker in Residence Valerie Scoon was nominated for an Emmy for the documentary “Sound of the Police,” and her film credits include Golden Globe-nominated “The Great Debaters,” starring Denzel Washington, and an adaptation of “Beloved,” by Pulitzer Prize-winning novelist Toni Morrison.

Many alumni have been nominated for Emmy Awards and Academy Awards, with several earning the awards. Adele Romanski won the Academy Award for Best Picture and Barry Jenkins won for Best Adapted Screenplay for “Moonlight” in 2017.

Six alumni were nominated for 2021 Emmy Awards for their work on television shows.

Five films nominated for the Academy Awards in 2023 included FSU Film School alumni on their crews.

Alumni productions have recently or will soon play at theaters around the U.S., air on Netflix, Disney+, Prime and the Hallmark Channel and be screened at prestigious film festivals.

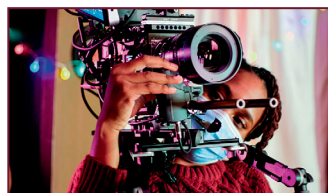
